exploitation. For this initiative, Demetri trained numerous law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Florida, and presented the program to the National Center of Sexual Exploitation in Washington D.C. Demetri earned his Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Homeland Security from the State

College of Florida.
